NOTES AND NEWS.

This season points scoring will start with the first race which will be held on Saturday, May 14th.

Points races will be held on Tuesday and Thursday evenings and on Saturday afternoons; evening races will start at 6.45 p.m. until the end of July, and thereafter at 6.30 p.m.; afternoon races will start at 3 p.m. Races will be started promptly at these times.

For the "Marhaziewe" Cup races the Mount's Bay Sailing Club has agreed to the suggestion that, for this season, races sailed at the Mount should take place on Saturday afternoons instead of on Friday evenings. It is hoped that this arrangement will encourage the maximum number of starters. Races at the Marazion and St. Michael's Mount, Mousehole, and Penzance Regattas will also be counted as races for this trophy.

Details of an additional course for Club Races are included in the Sailing Instructions which appear later in this book.

The Club Year Book appears in a new form this year.

It was felt that as the Redwing Dinghy Class is in the process of being adopted by the Royal Yachting Association as a national class, the Class Rules, which are being re-drafted, and the List of Dinghies and Owners would be included in a Redwing Association Year Book. Advertisements have also been omitted owing to the difficulties of obtaining them but it may again be possible to include advertising matter in future editions.

A new fixture in the season's programme is an Inter-Club Team Race against Helford River S.C., Restrouguet S.C. and St. Mawes S.C. There will be morning and afternoon races on Whit-Monday, May 30th, at Restrouguet and each club will provide its own boats.

The 1955 Redwing Championships will be held at Penzance from 5th to 10th September and arrangements are well in hand. It is hoped that the Championship will attract a large number of entries.

The Penzance Borough Council has been most helpful and has readily acceded to all the requests of the Club for facilities connected with the Meeting. The Club is indebted to the Council for its assistance.

The Club is also grateful to "The Penzance Club" and "The Pirates Club" for the facilities which they are providing during Championship Week.

Full details of the programme, sailing instructions, etc., will be published in a booklet in due course.

The Hon. Secretary will be grateful if any member who can assist during Championship Week will inform him as early as possible. Offers of help will be most welcome.

Last year's Championships at Torquay were extremely well organised and were most enjoyable. The only entries from Penzance were "Lynx" (145) P. C. Gartrell; "Plutotoo" (170) A. G. Bazeley and "Venus" (178) Mary Lane. The "Penzance Challenge Trophy" for the Inter-Club Team Race was won by the Club Team after one boat of the Looe S.C. Team was disqualified. In the Championship Race "Lynx" was 3rd, "Venus" was 8th and "Plutotoo" was 17th.

The August Bank Holiday Team Races were held last year as usual. The final results were:—Penzance S.C. 53½ points, Restronguet S.C. 47 points and Helford River S.C. 45 points.

We look forward to the next encounter on August 1st.

At the Annual General Meeting held on 7th March, 1955, it was decided that one Ladies' Race for the Diana Cup should be held this season. This race will be sailed on Saturday, 9th July, if weather conditions are suitable. If not the race will be postponed to a later date.

A draw for crews will be held but helmswomen may not sail with their usual skippers.

Minor amendments to the I.Y.R.U. Racing Rules have been made this year.

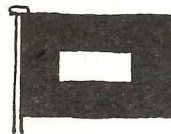
To Rule 30. 2(c) are added the words "in accordance with Rule 31(a)."

To Rule 32. 1. paragraph 2, the words in italics are added—"can herself round or pass the mark on the required side without tacking."

To Rule 38. 4(b) the words in italics are added—"The particular rule or alternative rule or sailing instruction alleged to have been broken."

SAILING INSTRUCTIONS FOR PENZANCE SAILING CLUB RACES.

1. COURSE FLAGS will be hoisted at the lighthouse as follows:—
 - (a) International Code flag "A," "X," "Y," or "R."
 - (b) Red or Green flag indicating port or starboard.
 - (c) 2, 3 or 4 Black and White pennants indicating 2, 3 or 4 rounds.
2. STARTING LINE. An imaginary line through two Black and White posts surmounted by triangles near the end of Penzance Pierhead. The distance mark, which also serves as a mark for certain courses, will be a Red and Yellow buff; and there will be an inner limit mark about 30 yards from the pierhead.
All races start North to South and finish South to North, over this line, between the two buffs.
3. RECALL. Will be by gun and megaphone. Sail numbers will be used as recall numbers.
4. LATE STARTERS. May paddle clear of the North Arm after the five minute gun provided they stop so as to ensure that they carry no way therefrom over the line.
5. STARTING PROCEDURE.

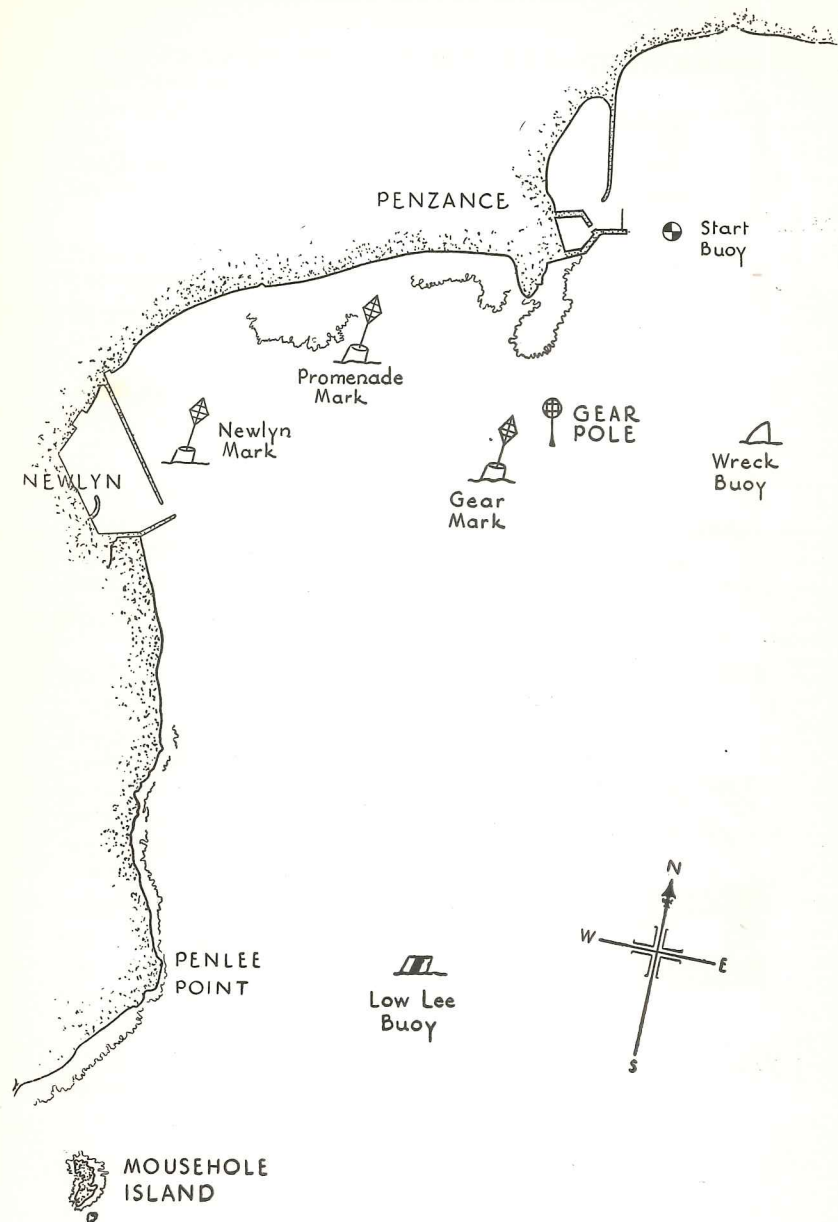

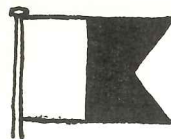
10 MINUTES before the start, course flags will be hoisted and a gun fired or other sound signal given.

5 MINUTES before the start, Code flag "P" (Blue Peter) will be broken out and a gun fired or other sound signal given.

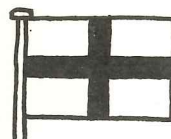
START. Flags will be lowered and a gun fired or other sound signal given.



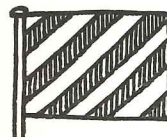

"A" COURSE PORT. After start leave Gear Mark to Starboard for first time, thereafter Newlyn Mark, Low Lee Buoy and Gear Mark all to Port. Return to finishing line after appropriate number of rounds.

"A" COURSE STARBOARD. After start leave Gear Mark, Low Lee Buoy and Newlyn Mark all to Starboard. At end of last round leave Gear Mark to Port and return to finishing line.

DISTANCE. $2\frac{3}{4}$ miles per lap, total for three laps, plus starting and finishing legs, $9\frac{1}{4}$ miles.

"X" COURSE PORT. Leave Gear Mark, Wreck Buoy, and Start Buoy all to Port (except Start Buoy at finish).

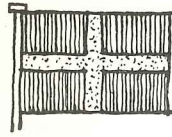
"X" COURSE STARBOARD. After Start leave Wreck Buoy, Gear Mark and Start Buoy all to Starboard.

DISTANCE. $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles per lap, total for three laps $4\frac{1}{2}$ miles.

"Y" COURSE PORT. After Start leave Gear Mark to Starboard first time, thereafter Promenade Mark, Newlyn Mark and Gear Mark all to Port. Return to finishing line after appropriate number of rounds.

"Y" COURSE STARBOARD. After Start leave Gear Mark, Newlyn Mark and Promenade Mark all to Starboard. At end of last round leave Gear Mark to Port and return to finishing line.

DISTANCE. $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles per lap, total for three laps, plus starting and finishing legs, $5\frac{1}{2}$ miles.



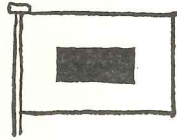

"R" COURSE STARBOARD. After Start leave Wreck Buoy, Low Lee Buoy and Newlyn Mark all to Starboard.

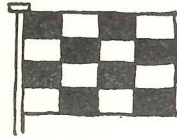
DISTANCE for two rounds $8\frac{3}{4}$ miles including starting and finishing legs.



7. SHORTENING COURSE.

Code flag "S" will be hoisted and a gun fired or other sound signal given to indicate that the race is to finish with the round about to be completed.

"S" Blue on White.



8. CANCELLATION OF RACE.

Code flag "N" will be hoisted to indicate cancellation.

"N" Blue and White.

9. All races will be sailed under the new I.Y.R.U. Rules except Rules 5 (Entries) and 11 (Declarations). A Rectangular Racing flag not less than 4 ins. by 6 ins. must be clearly displayed at the masthead while racing; if any boat fouls a mark or another boat she must at once haul down her flag and retire, or if another boat is to blame, hoist a protest flag.

10. PROTESTS. Must be lodged with the Secretary in writing within 24 hours of the start of the race, in accordance with R.Y.A. Rule 38.

Protests will be heard on the next succeeding evening Club Race fixture night or as soon thereafter as practicable.

R.Y.A. Rule 40 shall not apply to Club Races.
